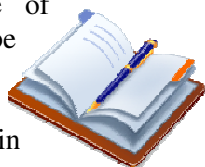
English

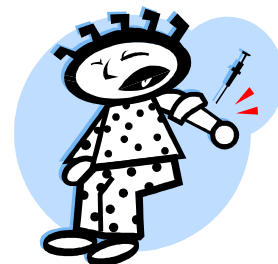
